Lennon Chang is an assistant professor at the Department of Applied Social Studies at the City University of Hong Kong. His research interests include governance of cyberspace—cybercrime, cyberterrorism, and cyberwarfare. He is especially interested in the regulation and governance of cyberspace in the Asia Pacific, and his 2012 book *Cybercrime in the Greater China Region: Regulatory Responses and Crime Prevention* looks at the nature and range of responses to cybercrime between China and Taiwan.

From 2005 to 2007, Lennon worked at the Science and Technology Law Centre, Institute for Information Industry, one of the most important think-tanks in Taiwan for legal responses to new technology. Before joining the City University of Hong Kong, he also worked at the Centre of Excellence in Policing and Security at the Australian National University.

Lennon received a PhD from the Australian National University in 2010. He also holds an LLB and a Master in Criminology from the National Taipei University.
